

COURSE/PROGRAME OUTCOME OF DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

Course / Programme Outcome

The main focus in the English Course at the UG Level is on basic knowledge of the British Literature, America Literature, European Literature and Women's writing, on preparation for research writings, on Indian Literature, English language and Linguistics, and acquiring of soft skills for jobs.

The college offers undergraduate Honours (Core), Discipline Specific Elective (DSE), Generic Elective (GE), Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) in English. The outcomes of these Courses are follows.

CO 1: To introduce students to British Poetry and Drama with an exploration of certain seminal texts.

CO 2: To acquaint students with the Jacobean and 18th century British Poetry and Drama.

CO 3: To acquaint students with the literary forms of essay and novel.

CO 4: To introduce students to Indian Writing in English.

CO 5: To acquaint students with the Romantic Era.

CO 6: To expose students to the 19th century British Literature and Criticism.

CO 7: To give the students a sense of the birth and growth of the American Literature.

CO 8: To familiarize students with the Early 20th century British Literature.

CO 9: To introduce students to European Classical Literature.

CO 10: To acquaint students with Women's Writing around the world.

CO 11: To introduce students to Modern European Drama.

CO 12: To create awareness of the rich Indian Classical Literature.

CO 13: To introduce students to Post Colonial Literature.

CO 14: To introduce various genres for better understanding of Popular Literature.

CO DSE-1: To give students a grounding in major methodological aspects of literary studies.

CO DSE-2: To introduce students to the study of World Literature.

CO DSE-3: To train students in the essentials of academic and research writing skills.

CO GE-1: To prepare students to succeed in complex academic tasks.

CO GE-2: To make students realize the essence of Modern Indian Literature.

CO GE-3: To encourage students understand the roles of Language, Literature and Culture.

CO GE-4: To provide students the basics of Language and Linguistics.

CO SEC-1: To train students in communication skills.

CO SEC-2: To train students the soft-skills for professional achievements, and the principles of literary translation.

CO AE-1: To help students imbibe literary skills and competence.

CO AE-2: To develop in students expository and creative writing skills.
